Graduation with High Distinction is limited to the top three percent of the class; Distinction, the next seven percent of the class. Graduation with designated honors (cum laude, magna cum laude, summa cum laude) is limited to students who participate in the College Honors Program. Students must complete at least four academic honors options and maintain a 3.50 gpa for cum laude, a 3.75 gpa for magna cum laude, and a 3.75 gpa plus submission of a summa thesis for summa cum laude honors.

However, sooner or later we must realize there is no one station, no one place to arrive at once and for all. The true joy of life is the trip. The station is only a dream. It constantly out-distances us.




Unfortunately, once we get "it," then "it" disappears. The station somehow hides itself at the end of an endless track.
