NANCY SKOLOS AND THOMAS WEDELL

Nancy Skolos and Thomas Wedell collaborate to diminish the boundaries between graphic design and photography—creating complex graphic design that is influenced by modern painting, technology, and architecture. The two have spent decades analyzing the unique characteristics of words and images—both consciously and subconsciously—and setting them in motion to fuse narrative with sensation.

Nancy is a former dean of architecture and design at the Rhode Island School of Design where she and Tom both still teach. They are in the midst of renovating a house built by Ira Rakatansky, which has significance in the architectural history of Providence.

Skolos and Wedell received the 2017 AIGA Medal and they have been recognized in international Poster Biennials and Triennials with work included in the graphic design collections of museums worldwide. They have authored two books: *Type, Image, Message* and *Graphic Design Process*.

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

This program contains the names of College of Design students who have applied to graduate from fall semester 2017 through summer 2018. This is not an official University of Minnesota graduation list.

HONORS

Graduation with designated Latin honors (cum laude, magna cum laude, summa cum laude) is limited to students who participate in the University of Minnesota Honors Program. Students must complete honors requirements, including a capstone or thesis project in their major, and, in their last 60 University of Minnesota credits, maintain a 3.50 GPA for cum laude, a 3.66 GPA for magna cum laude, and a 3.75 GPA for summa cum laude honors. To graduate with distinction, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher at graduation. To graduate with high distinction, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher. Candidates for academic honors are noted in this program.

PRESIDENT'S EMERGING SCHOLARS

The President's Emerging Scholars (PES) program is a four-year opportunity for select undergraduate students with diverse backgrounds and characteristics. There are approximately 310 students from various colleges graduating from the PES program this spring. Graduates are honored with a purple commencement cord.
