CONGRATULATIONS FROM COLLEGE OF DESIGN LEADERS

NILA R. LEISEROWITZ, FASID, FIID

Nila R. Leiserowitz is a builder and an entrepreneur—a pillar of both the design and business communities. For more than 40 years, at global companies like Gensler and Perkins+Will, she has championed mentorship initiatives, spearheaded talent development strategies, and pushed the limits of business performance.

As a trustee of the Chicago Architecture Center, World Business Chicago, and member of the Economic Club and International Women's Forum, Nila is an internationally recognized leader in workplace design innovation. Nila credits her success to her ability to reimagine what's possible, take calculated business risks, and cultivate great leaders to work alongside her.

Nila started her own firm at the age of 24, creating a new interior design delivery philosophy for the Minneapolis business community. She sold her successful business and joined the global firm Perkins+Will as Interiors Vice President. Starting in 1989, she led Perkins+Will's Interiors practice, where her passion for continuous professional growth led her to establish one of the architecture world's first talent development programs. She was also the first woman invited in the 75-year history of the firm to serve on the Perkins+Will Board of Directors.

In 1996 Nila brought her entrepreneurial spirit and tenacity to Gensler, a global architecture and design firm. She resurrected the Workplace practice in Los Angeles and introduced what is now known as Gensler's Workplace Survey—an independent research study that serves as a worldwide index of data-informed best practices related to the future of the office. Propelled by these triumphs, Nila took the helm of Gensler's Los Angeles office in 2004. Under her guidance—and specifically due to her financial foresight and intentional investment in people—the office weathered both the dot-com bubble and the Great Recession, emerging in a position to rebound ahead of other firms.

Beginning in 2010, Nila served as the Managing Principal of Gensler's North Central Region (one of 10 regions globally), where she elevated a culture of design excellence and established new markets including Healthcare, Planning & Urban Design, and Economic Analytics. She initiated programs to recruit, onboard, and retain key senior hires, effectively aligning business strategies with talent strategies. Under the influence of her leadership, the region's revenue more than doubled. In the last few years alone, the region has been recognized and awarded by nearly 70 different associations and agencies including IIDA, ASID, AIA, ASIA, ULI, Architizer, Chicago Building Congress, Chicago Tribune, and Crain's Chicago Business.

As global companies and next-generation startups seek to evolve their employee development and business initiatives in order to attract and retain top talent, address shifting client expectations, and take strategic planning to the next level to achieve key growth metrics in a complex business environment, Nila looks forward to lending her business acumen, extensive expertise, and fortitude in the face of change.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

The University's first official mace made its debut in 1961 at the inauguration of Meredith Wilson (1960–67), 110 years after the University was founded and eight centuries after the mace's warlike image faded and it became a symbol of peaceful leadership. Art Professor Philip Morton designed the University's mace, choosing a star as its crowning feature. The University machine shop made the mace with a solid aluminum handle set with the regents' seal and a 4-inch crystal sphere surmounted by the aluminum "Star of the North." Carrying the mace is a great honor accorded to someone who is being singled out for tribute.

A Home Economics Education graduate, Linda Mona began her career as a high school teacher and administrator before transitioning into retail store ownership and her own interior design firm. Linda stays heavily involved with the University of Minnesota while also being deeply engaged with volunteerism in the community. Ms. Mona serves on the College of Design Advisory Board, and was a member of the College of Human Ecology "Centennial 100." She was national president of the 60,000-member University of Minnesota Alumni Association and has been awarded both the Alumni Service Award and the Regents Outstanding Achievement Award.

HONORS

Graduation with designated Latin honors (cum laude, magna cum laude, summa cum laude) is limited to students who participate in the University of Minnesota Honors Program. Students must complete honors requirements, including a capstone or thesis project in their major, and, in their last 60 University of Minnesota credits, maintain a 3.50 GPA for cum laude, a 3.66 GPA for magna cum laude, and a 3.75 GPA for summa cum laude honors. To graduate with distinction, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher at graduation. To graduate with high distinction, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher. Candidates for academic honors are noted in this program.

PRESIDENT'S EMERGING SCHOLARS

The President's Emerging Scholars (PES) program is a four-year opportunity for select undergraduate students with diverse backgrounds and characteristics. There are approximately 350 students from various colleges graduating from the PES program this spring. Graduates will be honored with a purple commencement cord.
