

CFP: IMAGINE ANNUAL FACULTY RESEARCH GRANTS 2024

Established in 2007, through a generous gift from the McKnight Foundation to provide competitive financial support for research and scholarship in the arts, humanities, and design at the University of Minnesota, the Imagine Fund is driven by a strategic commitment to increase the impact and visibility of faculty work centered in these three disciplines. The **Annual Faculty Research Grants** are part of the Imagine Fund and are distributed through block grants to designated arts, humanities, and design colleges.

The College of Design will be distributing up to fifteen (15) grants of maximum \$5,000 each for a three-year funding period beginning in 2024.

January 19 | Torske Klubben Fellowship. \$16,000 stipend. For incoming and current master's and doctoral students to support future leaders with a cultural and/or professional interest in Norway.

January 31 | Judd Travel Grants. Up to \$2,500 for international travel by graduate and professional students to study, undertake internships, or conduct research abroad.

February 23 | <u>Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship</u>. \$25,000 stipend plus tuition and professional development support. For PhD candidates to finalize and write their dissertation during the fellowship year. Program Nomination required. December 31 | Sally Kress Tompkins Fellowship. \$12,000 stipend. A joint program of the Society of Architectural Historians and the Historic American Buildings Survey, for a graduate student in architectural history or a related field to conduct research on a nationally significant U.S. building or site during a 12-week period.

January 29 | Imagine Annual Faculty Research Grant. Up to \$5,000. Imagine grants support innovative research and scholarship in the arts, design, and humanities.

INTERNAL UMN

Rolling | IAS Call for Concepts. Up to \$5,000 to support promising, early-stage, interdisciplinary project ideas, especially ideas that align with IAS priorities. IAS Priorities: Advocating for racial justice; strengthening community engagement; expanding international partnerships; creating pathways for institutional transformation. UMN system faculty, instructors, and staff are eligible.

December 15 | <u>UMN GPSA International Travel Grants</u>. Up to \$2,000 for faculty and P&A staff to support the internationalization of the University on all campuses through research, teaching, and outreach.

December 15 | Early Innovation Fund from Technology Commercialization funds short-term projects that advance early-stage innovations. \$3,000 to \$10,000 per project. Eligibility: open to all UMN researchers and employees, including faculty, postdocs, graduate students, and staff.

January 29 | Imagine Arts, Humanities, and Design Chair Award. Up to \$100,000 per chair for a two-year term. The Imagine Fund Arts, Humanities, and Design Chair is administered by the Office of Faculty and Academic Affairs. January 29 | Imagine Fund Special Events Grant Program. Generally \$5,000-\$15,000. Supports new and ongoing activities across the University of Minnesota system that promote profound understanding of the human condition, excellence, innovation, collaboration, interdisciplinary dialogue, and greater public engagement with the University.

February 5 | Grant in Aid of Research, Artistry & Scholarship. Funds support the University's strategic plan MPact 2025 and academic excellence through the promotion of research, scholarly and artistic activities of faculty throughout the University. In FY23, the average award was \$34,608.

March 1 | Study of Writing in the Disciplines (WID). \$2,000-\$6,000. The Center for Writing's WID Grants program offers small grants to support faculty & instructor research on writing in their academic disciplines and as they cross disciplinary borders. A statement of interest is due March 1, 2024.

Select Faculty External Opportunities

Continuous | The Audacious Project invites big ideas that will catalyze social impact on a grand scale. Ideas submitted will be considered for future collaborative funding and invited proposals.

Rolling | Pioneering Ideas: Exploring the Future to Build a Culture of Health. Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is seeking new or unconventional ideas from any discipline focused on improving health equity and well-being.

December 18 | Arnold W. Brunner Grant. \$15,000 for advanced study in any area of architectural investigation that will effectively contribute to the knowledge, teaching, or practice of the art and science of architecture. The proposed investigation is to result in a final written work, design project, research paper, or other form of presentation.

January 24 | *NEW* Research on Innovative Technologies for Enhanced Learning (NSF). Up to \$900,000. Supports early-stage research in emerging technologies such as AI, robotics and immersive or augmenting technologies for teaching and learning that respond to pressing needs in real-world educational environments.

February 15 | *NEW* Grants for Arts Projects: Design (NEA). Up to \$100,000. Projects include architecture, communications and graphic design, fashion design, historic preservation, industrial and product design, interior design, inclusive design, landscape architecture, rural design, social impact design, and urban design.

February 16 | NIH Small Research Grant Program. Up to \$100,000. This program supports different types of projects including pilot and feasibility studies; secondary analysis of existing data; small, self-contained research projects; development of research methodology; and development of new research technology.

February 25 | Graham Foundation Grants to Organizations. Up to \$30,000. Assist with the production and presentation of significant programs about architecture and the designed environment in order to promote dialogue, raise awareness, and develop new and wider audiences.

March 5 | *NEW* Buildings Energy Efficiency Frontiers & Innovation Technologies (BENEFIT, Dept of Energy). Funding across four topic areas: Topic 1: Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning and Water Heating Technologies. Topic 2: Innovative, Replicable, and Low-Cost Roof and Attic Retrofits. Topic 3: Building Resilience and Capacity Constraints. Topic 4: Commercial Lighting Retrofit Advancements

March 25 | *NEW* Research Grants in the Arts (NEA). Up to \$100,000.Research Grants in the Arts funds research studies that investigate the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecosystem or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life.

April 1 | Smart and Connected Communities (NSF). Supports use-inspired research that addresses communities' social, economic and environmental challenges. Projects must work with community stakeholders on pilots that integrate intelligent technologies with the natural and built environments.


