January 19 | Torske Klubben Fellowship. \$16,000 stipend. For incoming and current master's and doctoral students to support future leaders with a cultural and/or professional interest in Norway.

January 31 | Judd Travel Grants. Up to \$2,500 for international travel by graduate and professional students to study, undertake internships, or conduct research abroad.

February 23 | <u>Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship</u>. \$25,000 stipend plus tuition and professional development support. For PhD candidates to finalize and write their dissertation during the fellowship year. Program Nomination required. February 5 | MN Historical Society Legacy Research Fellowships. \$3,500 fellowships are for scholars who are engaged in Minnesota-related research/scholarship that draws on Gale

Family Library resources and collections, and that adds to the body of knowledge and interpretation of Minnesota's history (pre- and post-statehood) and culture.

February 14 | ASID Student Portfolio Competition. \$6,000 scholarship for competition winners. Competition generates the best collection of student design projects in the nation, showcasing exceptional thought, innovation, and creativity. Submissions are evaluated on concept, content, context, and execution.

February 15 | Plant Humanities Summer Program (Dumbarton Oaks).

March 31 | International Furnishings and Design Association (IFDA) Scholarships. Various scholarships open to currently enrolled undergraduate and graduate students.

April 1 | AIA-AAH & AAH Foundation Fellowships in Health Facility Planning and Design.

INTERNAL CDES

January 29 | Imagine Annual Faculty Research Grant. Up to \$5,000. Imagine grants support innovative research and scholarship in the arts, design, and humanities.

INTERNAL UMN

Rolling | IAS Call for Concepts. Up to \$5,000 to support promising, early-stage, interdisciplinary project ideas, especially ideas that align with IAS priorities. IAS Priorities: Advocating for racial justice; strengthening community engagement; expanding international partnerships; creating pathways for institutional transformation. UMN system faculty, instructors, and staff are eligible.

January 29 | Imagine Arts, Humanities, and Design Chair Award. Up to \$100,000 per chair for a two-year term. The Imagine Fund Arts, Humanities, and Design Chair is administered by the Office of Faculty and Academic Affairs. January 29 | Imagine Fund Special Events Grant Program. Generally \$5,000-\$15,000. Supports new and ongoing activities across the University of Minnesota system that promote profound understanding of the human condition, excellence, innovation, collaboration, interdisciplinary dialogue, and greater public engagement with the University.

February 5 | Grant-in-Aid of Research, Artistry & Scholarship. Funds support the University's strategic plan MPact 2025 and academic excellence through the promotion of research, scholarly and artistic activities of faculty throughout the University. In FY23, the average award was \$34,608.

March 1 | Study of Writing in the Disciplines (WID). \$2,000-\$6,000. The Center for Writing's WID Grants program offers small grants to support faculty & instructor research on writing in their academic disciplines and as they cross disciplinary borders. A statement of interest is due March 1, 2024.

March 15 | $\underline{\sf UMN}$ GPSA International Travel Grants. Up to \$2,000 for faculty and P&A staff support the internationalization of the University on all campuses through research, teaching, and outreach.

Select Faculty External Opportunities

Continuous | The Audacious Project invites big ideas that will catalyze social impact on a grand scale. Ideas submitted will be considered for future collaborative funding and invited proposals.

Rolling | Pioneering Ideas: Exploring the Future to Build a Culture of Health. Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is seeking new or unconventional ideas from any discipline focused on improving health equity and well-being.

February 1 | *NEW* YouthBuild. Supports pre-apprenticeship services that support education, occupational skills training, and employment services to opportunity youth, ages 16 to 24, while performing meaningful work and service to their communities.

February 5 | *NEW* MN Historical Society Legacy Research Fellowships. \$3,500 fellowships are for scholars who are engaged in Minnesota-related research/scholarship that draws on Gale Family Library resources and collections, and that adds to the body of knowledge and interpretation of Minnesota's history (pre- and post-statehood) and

culture.

February 12 | *NEW* Science of Science: Discovery, Communication and Impact (NSF). To increase the public value of scientific activity, this program supports basic research in three fundamental areas: (1) How to increase the rate of socially beneficial discovery; (2) How to improve science communication outcomes; and (3) How to expand the societal benefits of scientific activity.

February 16 | NIH Small Research Grant Program. Up to \$100,000. This program supports different types of projects including pilot and feasibility studies; secondary analysis of existing data; small, self-contained research projects; development of research methodology; and development of new research technology.

February 21 | *NEW* EPA People, Prosperity and the Planet (P3) Student Design Competition. Up to \$75,000 for two years. Competitive program that provides teams of undergraduate and graduate students, led by a faculty mentor, to gain invaluable experience through classroom learning, laboratory and field work to address environmental issues.

February 25 | Graham Foundation Grants to Organizations. Up to \$30,000. Assist with the production and presentation of significant programs about architecture and the designed environment in order to promote dialogue, raise awareness, and develop new and wider audiences.

February 27 | *NEW* Partners for Places. \$180,000 to enhance local capacity to build equitable and sustainable communities in the United States and Canada.

March 5 | Buildings Energy Efficiency Frontiers & Innovation Technologies (BENEFIT, Dept of Energy). Funding across four topic areas: Topic 1: Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning and Water Heating Technologies. Topic 2: Innovative, Replicable, and Low-Cost Roof and Attic Retrofits. Topic 3: Building Resilience and Capacity Constraints. Topic 4: Commercial Lighting Retrofit Advancements

March 25 | Research Grants in the Arts (NEA). Up to \$100,000.Research Grants in the Arts funds research studies that investigate the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecosystem or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life.

April 1 | Smart and Connected Communities (NSF). Supports use-inspired research that addresses communities' social, economic and environmental challenges. Projects must work with community stakeholders on pilots that integrate intelligent technologies with the natural and built environments.

April 8 | *NEW* Responsible Design, Development, and Deployment of Technologies (ReDDDoT, NSF). Wide range of funding (\$300,000 - \$1,500,000) to support research, implementation and education projects involving multi-sector teams that focus on the responsible design, development or deployment of technologies.

April 17 | *NEW* Fellowships for Digital Publication (NEH). \$60,000 for individual scholars to support interpretive research projects that require digital expression and digital publication. NEH will read drafts. Optional draft deadline is February 28.


