April 1 | Collaborative Grant for Faculty. The College is inviting proposals for three \$15,000 collaborative grants from teams that have a PI and Co-PI from different programs. Successful proposals will include novel ideas that tackle local to global scale challenges.

Rolling | IAS Call for Concepts. Up to \$5,000 to support promising, early-stage, interdisciplinary project ideas, especially ideas that align with IAS priorities. IAS Priorities: Advocating for racial justice; strengthening community engagement; expanding international partnerships; creating pathways for institutional transformation. UMN system faculty, instructors, and staff are eligible.

March 1 | Study of Writing in the Disciplines (WID). \$2,000-\$6,000. The Center for Writing's WID Grants program offers small grants to support faculty & instructor research on writing in their academic disciplines and as they cross disciplinary borders. A statement of interest is due March 1, 2024.

March 7 | *NEW* Campus Climate Micro Grants. \$500 to \$1,200 for new or existing projects that actively contribute to enhancing our campus climate

March 11 | *NEW* Social Justice Impact Grant. \$25,000 - \$50,000 to support research that holds high potential for building a more equitable and just society, future external funding, and career advancement.

March 12 | *NEW* Institute on the Environment (IonE) 2024 Impact Goals Request for Proposals. IonE funded projects will catalyze environmental progress across 10 interconnected domains: Adaptation, Mitigation, Biodiversity, Clean Energy, Water and Land, Food Systems, Planetary Health, Environmental Justice, Natural Capital, Decision Support. IonE encourages teams to submit a statement of intent by February 12. Frequently Asked Questions

March 15 | *NEW* Community Action Research Grants. Up to \$45,000 for faculty to carry out research projects that answer questions about these important regional issues, in partnership with community groups, agencies, or organizations in Minnesota.

March 15 | <u>UMN GPSA International Travel Grants</u>. Up to \$2,000 for faculty and P&A staff support the internationalization of the University on all campuses through research, teaching, and outreach.

April 30 | *NEW* Minnesota Invasive Terrestrial Plants and Pests Center Request for Proposals. Funds support research that directly address: one or more high-priority invasive terrestrial species; AND one or more priority research themes.

Select Faculty External Opportunities

February 21 | EPA People, Prosperity and the Planet (P3) Student Design Competition. Up to \$75,000 for two years. Competitive program that provides teams of undergraduate and graduate students, led by a faculty mentor, to gain invaluable experience through classroom learning, laboratory and field work to address environmental issues.

February 25 | <u>Graham Foundation Grants to Organizations</u>. Up to \$30,000. Assist with the production and presentation of significant programs about architecture and the designed environment in order to promote dialogue, raise awareness, and develop new and wider audiences.

February 27 | Partners for Places. \$180,000 to enhance local capacity to build equitable and sustainable communities in the United States and Canada.

March 5 | Buildings Energy Efficiency Frontiers & Innovation Technologies (BENEFIT, Dept of Energy). Funding across four topic areas: Topic 1: Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning and Water Heating Technologies. Topic 2: Innovative,

Replicable, and Low-Cost Roof and Attic Retrofits. Topic 3: Building Resilience and Capacity Constraints. Topic 4: Commercial Lighting Retrofit Advancements

March 6 | *NEW* AARP Community Challenge Grant Program. Up to \$50,000 to help communities become great places to live for residents of all ages. The program is intended to help communities make immediate improvements and jump-start long-term progress.

March 15 | The Audacious Project invites big ideas that will catalyze social impact on a grand scale. Ideas submitted will be considered for future collaborative funding and invited proposals. Submit ideas before March 15 for the current funding round.

March 25 | Research Grants in the Arts (NEA). Up to \$100,000.Research Grants in the Arts funds research studies that investigate the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecosystem or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life.

April 1 | Smart and Connected Communities (NSF). Supports use-inspired research that addresses communities' social, economic and environmental challenges. Projects must work with community stakeholders on pilots that integrate intelligent technologies with the natural and built environments.

April 12 | *NEW* Growing Convergence Research (NSF). Supports transitioning teams from research that is multidisciplinary to research that transcends disciplinary boundaries with novel conceptual frameworks, theories and methods.

April 17 | Fellowships for Digital Publication (NEH). \$60,000 for individual scholars to support interpretive research projects that require digital expression and digital publication. NEH will read drafts. Optional draft deadline is February 28.

May 1 | *NEW* Civic Innovation Challenge (NSF). \$75,000 for Stage 1 Planning Grants that propose research and action driven by community priorities in Track A: Climate and Environmental Instability or Track B: Bridging the Gap between Essential Resources and Services & Community Needs.

Rolling | Pioneering Ideas: Exploring the Future to Build a Culture of Health. Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is seeking new or unconventional ideas from any discipline focused on improving health equity and well-being.
